The Association of Regional Center Agencies (ARCA) <u>represents</u> the twenty-one independent nonprofit <u>regional centers</u> in California that provide life-long services to about 350,000 individuals who have a developmental disability.







#### So...why ARCA?


- There are 21 regional centers.


